1. Welcome, Call to Order, Roll Call/Quorum Review

After a roll call took place, a quorum was confirmed.

2. Additions, Deletions, and Changes to the Agenda

There were no changes to the agenda.

3. Approval of May 16, 2024, Meeting and Minutes*

There was a motion to approve the May 16, 2024, Meeting minutes by Ms. Damato and seconded by Ms. Baptista. The May 16, 2024, Meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

4. LCB Membership

Ms. Jones went over the LCB Membership and the vacancies. Currently there are five (5) vacancies which include: Economically Disadvantaged, Disabled, Citizen Advocate/User, Citizen Advocate/Non-User, and Private For-Profit Transportation.

She is working on public outreach to fill the vacancies.

5. Northeast Florida Regional Council Update

Ms. Jones gave an update for the Northeast Florida Regional Council.

- On Wednesday, September 18th, the Florida Department of Transportation hosted a Regional Workshop for the 2055 Transportation Plan, which gave opportunities to collaborate with local agencies in the community, provide feedback on the Florida Transportation Plan vision and goals, and learn more about regional objectives.
- Ms. Jones is attending the FPTA/CTD Conference September 22nd 24th in West Palm Beach.
- Mobility week is from October 25th until November 2nd.
- The Northeast Florida Regional Council has moved from the WJCT Building to the Jessie Ball DuPont Center in Downtown Jacksonville.

6. Nassau County MOA (Memorandum of Agreement) *

Donovan Calicker with JTA (Jacksonville Transportation Authority) gave a brief presentation on the MOA. He also introduced Mia Johnson, who will be the point of contact for Nassau County. Ms. Baptista raised the question of how JTA will be marketing the new transportation provider and service. Mr. Calicker stated they are working on marketing and advertising.

There was some discussion on transferring the vehicles from FDOT (Florida Department of Transportation) to JTA and needing to have the transfers completed by October 1, 2024.

Marshall Eyerman, the Assistant County Manager, briefly spoke on the transition of a new transportation provider. He stated the NassauTransit website will remain the same as well as the phone number. There will be no indicator that there is a new service provider. He stated there will be new frequently asked questions that will be published so they are able to inform the public. Mr. Eyerman also discussed the service levels, such as life-sustaining and medical.

There was a motion to approve the MOA by Ms. Damato. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baptista. The MOA was approved unanimously.

7. Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) System Update

a) Annual Operation Report*

The Annual Operation Report is still under review. The report should be completed by the November LCB Meeting.

b) CTC Quarterly Update:

- Total paratransit trips for the 3 months ending June 30, 2024, was 9,370, which is a 34.2% decrease. This is due to Dayspring Village obtaining their own transportation. During the same period in 2023, the total number of paratransit trips was 14,235.
- The total number of paratransit trips per day (excl. Holidays, Sat & Sun) for the 3 months ending June 30, 2024, was 148.7, a 33.1% decrease. During the same period in 2023, the total number of paratransit trips per day was 222.4.
- During the 3 months ending June 30, 2024, the total public transit trips was 1,067, an 35.4% decrease. During the same period in 2023, the total number of public transit trips was 1652.
- c) Grants Update* There are currently no grant updates.

8. Old Business

There was no old business.

9. New Business

There was no new business.

10. Public Comment

Mr. Eyerman stated they are meeting weekly with JTA to have a seamless transition. They are also working to educate the public on the new transportation provider/transition.

11. Member and Department Report.

There were no member or department reports.

12. Adjournment

There being no further discussion, Chair Gray adjourned the meeting at 1:34 p.m. The next LCB meeting will occur on November 21, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. in the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners Meeting Room.
