

Key Definitions & Governing Statues of Program


Florida State Legislature created the Transportation Disadvantaged Commission (CTD) and Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) Trust Fund in 1989.

What is Transportation Disadvantaged?

- "Transportation disadvantaged" means those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk as defined in s. 411.202. (F.S)" 427.011 (F.S)
- The Transportation Disadvantaged Program is a coordinated state-wide effort that groups riders together for a shared ride service. Transportation services are available in all 67 Florida counties for those who are eligible and have no access to transportation. Federal, State, and Local agencies join together to provide necessary transportation to medical appointments, employment, educational, and other life-sustaining services.

Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD)

The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD) oversees the coordination of TD services across Florida's 67 counties. The CTD is made up of a 7-member governor-appointed board, with 8 ex-officio members, representing purchasing agencies, and staff that monitors activity at a regional level.

<u>Responsibilities</u>

- Approves the designation of every CTC at least every five years.
- Administers the TD Trust Fund, including the awarding of grants.
- Reviews and approves Commission publications, including the Annual Performance Report.
- Develops/approves policies governing coordinated transportation (e.g., rules, procedures, etc.).
- Participates in professional development events, including an annual training workshop.
- Appoints and oversees Executive Director.



Designated Official Planning Agency (DOPA)

The Northeast Florida Regional Council has proudly served as the CTD designated official planning agency for Baker, Clay, Flagler, Nassau, St. Johns, and Putnam since 1994. The Council was made the designated planning agency for Duval county in 2021.

Responsibilities

- Assist the Community Transportation Coordinator and Local Coordinating Board in the implementation of local Transportation Disadvantaged program(s).
- Staffs Local Coordinating Board.
- Appoints members to Local Coordinating Board(s).
- Procures and recommends Community Transportation Coordinator.
- Coordinates and conducts transportation planning activities for its service area.



Local Coordinating Board (LCB)

The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD) outlines 17 suggested stakeholders from varied communities to form LCB voting membership. These representatives collectively advocate the needs of their communities at LCB meetings to create the local coordinated system.

Local Coordinating Board (LCB) Continued

The LCB meets quarterly and provides guidance on local coordination of transportation services.

Responsibilities

- Assists in establishing eligibility guidelines and trip priorities.
- Assist with the development of the TD Service Plan.
- Evaluates the performance of CTC.
- Identifies and prioritizes local service needs.
- Appoints a grievance committee.
- Reviews and recommends other funding applications.
- Reviews strategies of service provision to the area.
- Evaluates local and regional transportation opportunities.



Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC)

CTCs are contracted agencies that provide transportation to TD customers in designated service areas. CTCs are funded by the CTD and must abide by their standards, including receiving guidance from an LCB.

Responsibilities

- Coordinates transportation services for a county.
- Provides and/or contracts with transportation operators to deliver trips for TD customers.
- Determines TD eligibility and performs gatekeeping duties.
- Invoices purchasing agencies.
- Assists Local Coordinating Board in developing their Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan.
- Submits annual operating report (AOR) data.

Who we are...

St. Johns County Council on Aging, Inc. (SJCCOA) is a private, non-profit corporation that has been serving the needs of the elderly in St. Johns County since 1973. The mission of SJCCOA's transportation program is to provide safe, affordable, and reliable mobility options to the transportation disadvantaged citizens of St. Johns County.

We are the CTC

- In October, 1983, SJCCOA accepted the invitation to serve as the designated Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) as appointed by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and has proudly done so for almost four decades.
- COA will continue this appointed designation through June 30, 2026.

But what does it mean to be the CTC?

The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged designates a Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) for each county/service area.

The CTC is responsible for coordinating and/or providing transportation services to individuals who are <u>transportation disadvantaged</u>.

Transportation Disadvantaged Defined

Persons who, because of physical or mental disability, income status, age, or who are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation may have their fare subsidized by funding from the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged.

COA Paratransit Service Defined

We provide non-emergency medical and other transportation services within the St. Johns County Service area on a door-to-door basis for ambulatory and wheelchair bound passengers, and door-through-door service for stretcher passengers.

Who is eligible?

- Those who cannot provide or purchase their own transportation.
- The general public and the elderly.
- Persons with disabilities or who may be temporarily disabled

Paratransit Service Cont'd...



What is the Cost?

- Fares are dependent upon your sponsorship and funding source. When you make your reservation, you will be informed of the cost of your trip.
- The driver will collect the fare from you when you board the vehicle.
- Please have exact change, as drivers do not carry money and will not be able to make additional stops in order to get change.

Paratransit Service Cont'd...

What if I have Medicaid?

- Those who have or who are eligible for Medicaid must contact their HMO's medical transportation broker to arrange medical related trips.
- Those who do not wish to use their appointed third-party medical transportation service can use the SJC Council on Aging's transportation service by paying the standard rates (aka 'Private Pay').
- Transportation for eligible Medicaid recipients for non-medical related trips can be provided based upon the review of the eligibility beneficiary intake form for transportation.

Sunshine Bus Defined



The Sunshine Bus Company is St. Johns County's award winning public transportation system.



It was established in May of 2000.



The system has grown from two (2) routes and a first month's ridership of 414 (8,184 the first 8 months) to its current nine (9) routes with an average monthly ridership of over 23,300 (280,445 in 2019).

3. Approval of September 12, 2023, Meeting Minutes*

Mr. Stephenson motioned for approval of the September 12, 2023, meeting minutes. Mr. Albert seconded the motion. The September 12, 2023, meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

Ms. Pamela Hagley stated she was present at the September 12, 2023, meeting. The meeting minutes and attendance record reflect that she was absent. There was a motion to amend the attendance record/minutes by Mr. Albert and seconded by Ms. Fenech. The amendment was approved unanimously.

5. Grievance Procedure Review*

Grievance Procedures are established for grievances to be brought before the Grievance Subcommittee. Grievance procedures are used when a passenger, system user/advocate, sponsoring agency, and/or community service provider/subcontractor has a concern, complaint, or problem relative to transportation services.

There were no suggested changes to the current Grievance Procedures. The LCB unanimously approved the current grievance procedures as written with a motion from Mr. Albert and a second from Ms. Fenech.

6. Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC) Update

- a) Summer Jones the new TD Coordinator gave a brief introduction of herself.
- b) The NEFRC is hosting the 20th Annual NEFRC Elected Officials and Regional Awards of Excellence Luncheon on Thursday, January 4, 2024, at 12:00 pm. Invitations will be sent out within the next few weeks. There is an award for Transportation. The award for transportation will be to recognize either an individual, entity, or specific project with a primary focus on improving the quality of transportation options available to the citizens of Northeast Florida.

7. Community Transportation Coordinator System Update

a) CTC Quarterly Update – Mr. McCord gave the following updates:

We reviewed the CTC Quarterly Report, which was included in the member meeting packets for review.

Ridership numbers are as follows for July 1, 2023 – September 30, 2023: 10,857 trips and 25,421 total riders. Mr. McCord stated that during the holiday season, ridership numbers will sometimes take a slight decrease.

- 1) Introduction of Mr. Nelson Wiley as the Operations Manager. He has held different positions with the Council on Aging. He will be attending the TD Meetings regularly.
- 2) Mobility Week was very successful. There were six (6) different awards and prizes that were given out to members who rode the Sunshine Bus and Paratransit.
- 3) There was an order placed for four (4) new buses. Buses will be designated for both the Sunshine Bus and Paratransit. As of now, there is no timeline/delivery date.
- 4) They are continuously working with Google on the General Transit Feed Specification (GTFS) at the different bus stops.

b) Annual Operation Report*

The total number of trips is as follows: 2021= 113,664 trips, 2022= 128,242 trips, 2023= 150,286 trips.

There was a motion to approve the Annual Operation Report (AOR) by Mr. Stephenson and a second by Mr. Albert. The AOR was approved unanimously.

- c) Grants Update* (Approval if Required)
 - 1) They participated in the Federal Grants Workshop in October. They are actively working to submit grants.

8. Old Business

a) St. Johns Public Schools / St. Johns County Council on Aging Coordination Ms. Jones asked if there was an update on this coordination. Mr. McCord stated there has not been a meeting due to it being the holiday season. They would like to revisit in January.

9. New Business

There is no new business at this time.

10. Public Comment

No public comment at this time.

11. Member and Department Reports

Pamala Hagley (AHCA) - Medicaid open enrollment letters have been mailed. The open enrollment period is December 1st – January 31st, 2024, which is 60 days.

12. Adjournment

Chair Joseph adjourned the meeting at 1:57 p.m. The next LCB meeting and Annual Public Hearing will occur February 13, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. in the St. Johns Council on Aging Boardroom.
