PROJECT & PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



The Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC) is pleased to announce that it has been awarded \$1,009,099 in federal funds from the Department of Defense's Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation. This funding will support the development of a Military Installation Readiness Review and Implementation Action Plan (MIRR) aimed at enhancing military readiness and response to natural and human-made hazards while directly addressing future conditions that require longer-term planning, mitigation, and investment.

"This project represents a significant step forward in strengthening the resilience of our military installations and the communities they serve," said Fara Ilami, Regional Resiliency Manager of the NEFRC. "By actively engaging military commanders, municipal and county governments, economic development organizations, and the State of Florida, utilizing previously developed regional tools and plans, best practices, and qualitative data. Through these efforts, we are fostering collaboration that will pay dividends in terms of readiness and response."

A kickoff meeting will be held in the Spring to inform stakeholders about the project; more details to follow. For more information please visit our website.



The Community Visioning Initiative is a new initiative at the Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC). The program is funded by the Economic Development Administration to inspire smaller communities to envision and plan for a future that is vibrant, resilient, and community–driven. The NEFRC will provide this service to smaller communities that lack the resources to undertake a visioning process.

This program will engage community stakeholders to create a unique vision plan for each community. Throughout the process, the NEFRC will focus on long-term resiliency, create a shared vision, cultivate equity, guide development, increase community capacity, and enhance quality of life. The NEFRC will engage in a robust 6-month visioning program that prioritizes community engagement for selected communities.

PROJECT & PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



The Regional Community Institute of Northeast Florida, in collaboration with the Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC) hosted a series of trail itinerary development workshops in the seven counties of Northeast Florida. These workshops convened stakeholders and interested citizens in each county to assist in developing trail itineraries that residents, visitors, and outdoor enthusiasts can use. These itineraries include information about access, amenities, safety considerations, historical/cultural attributes, the environment, and local plants and animals.

Attendees provided recommendations on suggested marketing and promotional efforts. NEFRC staff plan to take the draft itineraries and create a standardized format for the region. Staff will also work with local destination marketing organizations to identify amenitites that can be included on the itineraries, and for outreach and marketing activities.

NEFRC 2025 Workplan

Tackling the Trash Together: Innovative Solutions for Solid Waste Management

At the January Board meeting, the NEFRC Board of Directors approved the 2025 workplan focusing on solid waste. Workplans allow the NEFRC to engage issues that are relevant and timely to the Northeast Florida Region. Previous workplans have addressed ecotourism & trails, the opioid epidemic and affordable housing.

"Tackling the Trash Together: Innovative Solutions to Solid Waste Management," is a framework that will explore the challenges each local government faces – from costs, availability of services, capacity, expansion, and integration of new technologies. The work has started with identifying key stakeholders who will build a foundation of data and information on this topic.
